## Biography Dr. Howard Pinderhughes, Ph.D.

Dr. Howard Pinderhughes, Ph.D., is Vice-Chair of <u>Prevention Institute</u>'s Board of Directors, Chair and Professor in the <u>Department of Social and Behavioral Sciences</u>, University of California San Francisco, and a Research Associate at the <u>Center for Research on Social Change</u>, University of California Berkeley.

A social and behavioral scientist and author, Dr. Pinderhughes has conducted research and program development in the areas of race relations among youth and adolescent violence prevention and intervention.

His research combines aspects of grounded theory, qualitative methods, survey research and participatory action research to examine problems related to the impacts of structural inequality, racial, class and gender dynamics on adolescent health and relations.

In 2016, Dr. Pinderhughes, along with Rachel A. Davis, M.S.W. and Myesha Williams, M.S.W. published a report, <u>"Adverse Community Experiences and Resilience: A Framework for Addressing and Preventing Community Trauma."</u>

His 1997 book, Race in the Hood: Conflict and Violence Among Urban Youth, presents a study of racial attitudes among youth and racial violence in New York City.

Dr. Pinderhughes is currently developing a conceptual framework to address the production of racial, class and gender health inequality.
